

VIII. SIGNIFICANT EFFECTS WHICH CANNOT BE AVOIDED

As discussed in Chapter V of this EIR, implementation of *Strategy 2000* would result in the following significant unavoidable adverse impacts:

- Significant plan and cumulative contributions to traffic congestion.
- Significant plan and cumulative contributions to regional air pollution in the near term.
- Significant cumulative impacts to architectural and archaeological resources.

Strategy 2000 in conjunction with other foreseeable projects would also result in significant unavoidable cumulative impacts to land use (from increased traffic), visual resources (loss of unobstructed views), transportation and circulation, air quality, noise, cultural resources, and energy.

All other significant impacts associated with implementation of *Strategy 2000* could be mitigated to a nonsignificant level with implementation of mitigation measures identified in this EIR.
