

Proposed Actions to Implement *Beyond the Greenprint* and related concepts:

1. Adopt the vision of a citywide trail-linked network of major parks, as generally described in “Beyond the Greenprint,” with any modifications suggested and approved by the majority of Task Force members.
2. Consistent with the Envision Task Force’s commitment to a bold vision for parks and open space, direct the staff to identify several future large park sites in geographically dispersed sites throughout the City. Staff should report those results to the Task Force at a future meeting.
  - a. Staff’s identification of such sites should include a mechanism for unequivocally preserving land for major sites. Whatever device that Planning staff employs-- park overlays, “floating” park designations, or any other land designation-- must clearly establish the plan for a large park site without exposing the City to inverse condemnation liability
  - b. Staff should include in its analysis consideration of such locations as the County Fairgrounds, the Lester property, the former Pleasant Hills Golf Course, Coyote Valley, and North San Jose.
3. To address concerns regarding the inadequacy of open space amid rapid housing growth and increasing densities, direct staff to report back with a recommended implementation measure—such as phasing or “triggers”--that can be adopted to ensure that major open space/ park development accompanies residential development..
4. To demonstrate a commitment to link key trails throughout the City, incorporate creek trails and other major trails—including a future Willow Glen Spur/Three Creeks trail—as an explicit, visually apparent element of the final 2040 Transportation-Land Use diagram.
